## **Corrections**.

In the just published number of the seventeenth volume of the »Entomologiske Meddelelser« Monsieur le Docteur Henri Bertrand writes on page 300, lines 22 and 23 of his valuable contribution »Notice sur les larves de Dytiscides de la collection Meinert« as follows: »Après de longues recherches, Wesenberg-Lund et Bøving ont réussi en 1912 à capturer des larves plus âgées [de *Noterus clavicornis*].« This record is incorrect. The credit for having discovered the mature larva of *Noterus* belongs only to Prof. Wesenberg-Lund. Some time after he had found the larva and studied its life habits I accompanied hin on a trip to which he had invited me for the purpose of obtaining material for the Museum collection. Evidently it is the material from this collecting trip to which Monsieur Bertrand alludes in the said lines.

I avail myself of the present opportunity of correcting another record which erroneously credits me with the discovery of another remarkable larval form. In the first number of the thirteenth volume of »Entomologiske Meddelelser« Mr. J. P. Kryger mentions on page 31, lines 2 and 3, that the two larvae of *Olisthopus rotundatus* Payk. obtained on a collecting trip which Mr. Kryger and I made to »Amager Fælled« in 1910 are placed in the larval collection of the Zool.-Museum under a label indicating that I should be the collector. This is a mistake. It was Mr. Kryger who collected the two larvae, and the credit for this discovery should go to him alone.

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
