### 190. Colymbus septentrionalis, Lin. — Plongeon à gorge rousse. — Roodkelige zeeduiker.

Vu nageant sur la mer le 28 juillet 1887. (Lützenrath.)

191. Uria troile, Lin. - Guillemot à capuchon. - Zeekoet.

Plusieurs ont été tués à Ostende le 8 janvier 1889. (A. Dubois.) — Un individu a été tué sur l'Escaut près d'Anvers le 15 février de la même année. (Roels.)

192. Podiceps auritus, Lin. - Grèbe oreillard. - Geoorde fuut.

Anvers. C'est la première fois que j'ai à faire constater la capture de cet oiseau à l'état adulte dans nos environs. Je n'en ai jamais eu en chair que des jeunes. Des individus adultes ont été capturés les 10 et 20 juin et 19 août 1889. Je dois supposer qu'au printemps il y ait eu un passage de ces oiseaux dont plusieurs couples ont niché. (Croegaert.) — Un grèbe adulte de cette espèce a été tué le 11 avril 1889 sur l'Escaut près d'Anvers. (Roels.)

193. Podiceps grisegena, Bodd. — Grèbe jougris. — Roodhalsfuut.

Anvers. Cet oiseau a été pris dans nos environs les 21 et 23 juin et 25 octobre 1889. (Croegaert.)

194. Podiceps fluviatilis (Briss.) - Grèbe castagneux. - Dodaars.

Un sujet fut tué sur la Senne à Haeren en janvier 1889. (Duvivier.) — Il est assez rare à Taviers. (Wautier.) — En hiver il est très commun sur l'Escaut.

### V. Report on Birds in Danmark, 1887.

### Compiled by Herluf Winge.

(See Map, Ornis vol. IV.)

Observations have been communicated by:

A.: H. Arctander, physician, Storehedinge, Stevns, Själland. Observations in Stevns.

B.: Kr. Barfod, cand. theol. Observations from the surroundings of Vordingborg, southern coast of Själland. Also some notes from Lolland.

F.: A. H. Faber, cand. pharm. Notes from Viborg (January 1st to August 1st), from Fölleslev, northwestern Själland, N. E. of Kallundborg (September, October), from Mors (November, December). Vester Lyng, a locality often mentioned, is a somewhat barren area on the coast N. W. of Fölleslev. — Some of the species, spoken of in the preceding reports as common at Viborg, this year have not been mentioned.

Hl.: O. Helms, stud. med. Chiefly observations from the surroundings of Kjöbenhavn.

K.: Th. N. Krabbe, physician. Observations from the island of Amager, S. of Kjöbenhavn, especially from the coasts.

P.: Severin Petersen, schoolmaster, Slotsbjergby, a village at Slagelse, Själland. Notes from the surroundings of Slagelse, occasionally also from other places.

W.: my late brother Oluf Winge, compiler of the

reports for 1885 and 1886\*); also for this report he had done some preparatory work. Notes from Kjöbenhavn. For general remarks see Report 1885. He was ill from the beginning of February to the end of the year; observations were therefore almost confined to immediate surroundings, especially garden; only three times during the year he got just beyond limit of suburb. Species observed consequently only 84. - Some observations, signed H. W., have been, made by myself. As my brother, also I have for several years noted down the observations of every day; but my notes during the two previous years generally being not additional to his, they were not mentioned in the reports; very many of our observations have been made in common (and these are signed W.). Also I this year have been very little in the field; total number of species observed by me 82; together we have seen 96\*\*); in more happy years we use to see about 130.

Some notes from various sources, indicated in each case, have been added by the compiler.

From all the Light-stations, 64 in number (see Report 1886), reports have been sent in by the keepers. Only at 33 of the lights birds have been killed striking the lanterns;

\*) It has been stated in England that the Report for 1885 »would be of great use to persons visiting Denmark in search of eggs«. My brother would have been the first to deplore such advertisments. Gamekeepers and egg-collectors have exterminated a good many of the wild birds of England and rendered the British avifauna more uniform than it ought to be; students of nature mourn the loss of several species. Of gamekeepers and collectors we have in Danmark already too many; it would be a pity, if also strangers should join in destroying our fauna. Happily the laws of our country give some protection.

### General Report.

### 1. Milvus regalis, auct. - Glente.

Kjöbenhavn. March 26th at 10,5 A. M. two coming in from Sound, going S. W.; mild, cloudy, W. N. W., fresh. September 18th one soaring. (W., H. W.) — Storehedinge. March 23d seen. (A.) — Viborg. First seen March 17th at a breeding place in Hald Bögeskov. May 12th in a nest (last year occupied by Ravens) one dead young and two hard set eggs; the old bird, before flying off, was seen covering the eggs with rags that were lying on the border of the nest. (F.)

2. Cerchneis tinnunculus, L. - Taarnfalk.

Kjöbenhavn. January 10th one. September 18th, 12,55 P. M., one male circling, going S. W. (W.) — Fölleslev. In September and October a pair often seen over the fields. (F.) — Slagelse. Breeding in the church of Slotsbjergby. (P.)

### 3. Falco subbuteo, L. - Lärkefalk.

Kjöbenhavn. Singly a few times in north-eastern suburb. September 15th last. (W.) — Vordingborg. June 9th 1886, nest with three eggs. (B.)

### 4. Falco peregrinus, Tunst. - Vandrefalk.

Kjöbenhavn. In town and suburbs several times in March. Probably in actual migration: April 9th at 1,30 P. M. one very high to N.; sunshine, N., light. April 17th at 11,55 A. M. one, high, going N.; cloudy, N. W., fresh. In town again seen August 29th and not unfrequently in the later part of the year. (W., H. W.)

### 5. Accipiter nisus, L. - Spurvehög.

Vordingborg. May 12th, in a spruce, nest with two eggs; on these being taken, other eggs were laid, that were successively also taken, as follows: May 19th one, 26th two, 29th one, June 5th three; then the nest was deserted. (B.) -- Viborg. In January and February often seen. Rindsholm Skov, May 15th nest with five fresh eggs. (F.)

### 6. Pandion haliaëtus, L. - Fiskeörn.

Amager. One, young bird, shot August 28th. (K.) — Falster. Breeding yearly in a high beech in Korselidse Österskov. (B.)

### 7. Haliaëtus albicilla, L. - Havörn.

Viborg. In the nest in Lindum Skov first egg April 1st; six days later another. (F.)

### 8. Pernis apivorus, L. - Hvepsevaage.

Kjöbenhavn. Passing garden in migration: May 19th at 7,5 P. M. two, coming up from S. E., went away to W.; at 7,17 P. M. two, coming up from S. E., went away to N. E. and N.; cloudy, W. May 22d at 10,23 A. M. four to N.; at 10,45 four to N. E.; dark, N., fresh. May 30th from 6,35 to 7,10 P. M. altogether at least 50 coming up in straggling flocks or singly from S. and S. S. W., circling over the coast, going away to N.; clear some clouds, N. September 16th at 12,43 one to W.; cloudy, S. S. W., fresh. September 18th at 1 P. M. one to W. S. W.; cloudy, N., moderate.(W.) — Vordingborg. September 16th one shot. (B.)

## Archibuteo lagopus, Brünn. — Vinter-Musevaage. Storehedinge. October 13th one shot. (A.)

### 10. Buteo vulgaris, Leach. — Musevaage.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. January 16th one. March 28th at 9,50 A. M. one passing N., then W. N. W.; overcast, N. E., moderate. March 29th at 2,5 P. M. two circling, going in northerly direction; the same day two, one, and two were seen passing at different times. — In fall seen as follows: September 26th, 1,45 P. M., 17 to N. W.; October 4th at 12,35 P. M. one to N. N. W.; sunshine, N. W. fresh. 5th one circling over the coast and then going N. W. at 1,10 P. M.; clear, N. W., moderate. 8th at 1,15 P. M. three away to W.; clear, N. W., fresh. (W., H. W.) — Storehedinge. March 22d shot. (A.) — Vordingborg. Common. April 16th three eggs in a nest that in the preceding year was occupied by Ravens. (B.)

### 11. Circus aeruginosus, L. - Rörhög.

Vordingborg. Yearly breeding at Kjöng Nor. — At Maribo Sö, Lolland, this year six pairs. (B.)

### 12. Syrnium aluco, L. - Natugle.

Fölleslev. Breeding in the church. (F.) — Slagelse. Breeding in the church of Slotsbjergby. (P.) — Vordingborg. Common. March 28th four eggs in an old crow's nest. (B.)

### 13. Otus vulgaris, Flem. - Skov-Hornugle.

Vordingborg. Bjergemark Skov, March 28th nest with two eggs. (B.)

14. Caprimulgus europaeus, L. - Natravn.

Amager. September 9th one found dead. (K.) - At Endrupholm, Ribe, in summer. (P.)

### 15. Cypselus apus, L. - Mursvale.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. May 1st one; 4th one; 12th seven; 14th almost full numbers. Continually numerous to about August 20th, then decreasing; August 26th two, 28th one, September 2d two, 3d one. (W., H. W.) — Amager, near town. May 15th some, first. September 4th one; again September 11th, last. (K.) — Fölleslev. In September seen rather frequently; 11th one shot. (F.) — Common in Slagelse; some breeding in Slotsbjergby. (P.) — Storehedinge. May 7th seen. Most had disappeared August 12th; September 15th one was seen. (A.) — Vordingborg. Breeding in numbers. (B.) — Viborg. May 21st one, first. (F.)

### 16. Hirundo rustica, L. - Forstuesvale.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. April 24th one, 25th one, 30th a small party, about ten together. May 1st and 4th a few; from 6th continually; from 14th common. — Decrease marked from September 16th; continually some to October 1st; 3d, 4th, 5th, 8th, and 16th a few, mostly young; 25th one young. (W., H. W.) — Amager. May 1st a few, 8th rather common, 19th in full numbers. October 2d small flocks, 9th and 16th a few. (K.) — Fölleslev. Common till the beginning of October. October 14th a few. (F.) — Storehedinge. April 30th first. (A.) — Viborg. May 5th first seen. (F.) — A white variety, shot at Nörre Tvede, Själland, September 5th, presented to the Museum by Mr. Mikkelsen.

### 17. Hirundo urbica, L. - Bysvale.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. May 4th some; from 6th continually a few, from 15th more numerous, from 19th perhaps full numbers. — Marked decrease from middle of September and especially from 18th and 19th; continually a few to October 2d; 3d one. (W., H. W.) — Amager. May 15th a few, 19th many. (K.) — Storehedinge. May 6th seen. (A.) — Viborg. Arrived in full numbers not till May 20th and 21st. (F.)

### 18. Hirundo riparia, L. - Digesvale.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. May 1st one, 4th some. — Several times in September, mostly singly or a few together; 25th one, last. (W., H. W.) — Amager. May 22d two, 29th many. September 11th great numbers; one albino shot, presented to the Museum. Later none. (K.) — Vordingborg. Very common. (B.) — Viborg. May 7th many had arrived at a breeding place. (F.)

### 19. Cuculus canorus, L. - Gjög.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. May 14th first heard. (H. W.) — Amager. May 8th one, again July 3d and 21st, not else. (K.) — Vordingborg. Eggs, mostly in the nests of Sylvia cinerea, from May 26th to June 30th. (B.)

### 20. Alcedo ispida, L. - Isfugl.

Amager. January 23d one seen. (K.) — Storehedinge. January 20th one shot at Vemmetofte. (A.)

21. Coracias garrula, L. — Ellekrage. Storehedinge. August 27th one seen. (A.)

### 22. Oriolus galbula, L. - Pirol.

Yearly breeding at Engestofte, Lolland. In 1886, after the breeding season, were seen about twenty or thirty. (Wichfeld, possessor of Engestofte. B.) — Breeds every year in gardens in Ribe and at Bramminge and Endrupholm. At Endrupholm three or four pairs; they arrive regularly between the 14th and 16th of May. (P.)

### 23. Sturnus vulgaris, L. - Stär.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. February 10th two, 14th three, thence continually some; full numbers probably not till rather late in March, after the middle of the month. —

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June 3d first young flown in garden, 4th several more, from various nests; 7th decreasing, most having left garden; 8th none in garden; 12th two old and three young again in garden. - October, common; from 17th rather suddenly decreasing; 18th to 21st and 24th a few; 25th a party of 15. (W., H. W.) - Amager. Middle of January four in the fortification territory. (Hl.) - January 30th a flock of 11-12; February 6th, 13th, 20th, and 27th small flocks; March 6th common. June 5th some young birds seen, June 14th in great numbers. October 23d a large flock, 30th a few; November 6th two, 20th one. (K.) - Storehedinge. February 2d first. (A.) - Viborg. January 30th first seen. -In Mors not observed this winter, 1887/88. (F.) — A white variety from Klitgaard, Vendsyssel, presented in the flesh to the Museum by Mr. Ditlevsen, June 13th. - Sent from the Lights. February: 23d\*) Romsö 1, Helholm 1; 25th Läsö Rende 1, Skjoldnäs 3; 26th Egense 2. March: 24th Helholm 1; 25th Hjelm 1; 27th Hjelm 1, Skjoldnäs 2. April: 2d Läsö Rende 1, Anholt 2; 24th Anholt 2. October: 16th Hesselö 1, Stevns 1; 18th Horns Rev 3; 28th Horns Rev 3. November: 9th Horns Rev 1.

### 24. Lycos monedula, L. - Allike.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. Seen throughout the year. Migration observed March 25th: at 10,5 A. M. 10 over coast to N.; at 10,55 A. M. 13 to N.; overcast or cloudy, S. S. E., light. (W.) — Fölleslev. In fall in flocks in the fields. (F.) — Slagelse. Now and then it visits the church of Slotsbjergby, but does not breed. (P.) — Vordingborg. Breeding in most churches in the surroundings, also frequently in hollow trees. (B.)

### 25. Corvus corax, L. - Ravn.

Vordingborg. Iselingen Skov, April 19th 1886, nest with two incubated eggs. Oreby Skov, March 29th 1887, nest with six eggs; on these being taken, a new nest was

built, in which April 18th were again six eggs. (B.) — Viborg. Hald Skov, March 31st, nest with four eggs. Bigum Skov, April 1st, nest with seven hard set eggs. Avnsbjerg Skov, April 3d, nest with three eggs. (F.)

### 26. Corvus cornix, L. - Krage.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. Large numbers wintering. Actual migration: March 24th many passing E. or N. E. the whole day; overcast or cloudy, W., strong. October 15th three to W. at 12,35 P. M.; sunshine, E., fresh. 16th in the forenoon some to W., coming in from sound; sunshine, N., fresh. (W., H. W.) — Amager. Compare Report 1886. (K.) — Fölleslev. Breeding in gardens and small woods. (F.)

### 27. Corvus frugilegus, L. - Raage.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. In January and the first part of February a few; from February 24th more numerous. March 15th, 10,5 A. M., one in actual migration over the coast to N. E., sunshine, S. W. In October, November and December but very few. (W., H. W.) — Amager. Only a few times seen; February 27th first. (K.) — Fölleslev. A large colony in the garden at Egemarke. (F.) — Slagelse. Frequently moving about in large flocks. Breeds in numbers in the woods at Skjelskör. (P.)

### 28. Pica caudata, auct. - Skade.

Amager. Compare Report 1885. (K.) — Slagelse. Formerly common at Slotsbjergby, now reduced in number, while shot away. It has been witnessed killing young just flown Starlings\*). (P.) — Vordingborg. Rather uncommon. — Lolland. Very common. (B.)

<sup>&</sup>quot;) "The appearance of the above notes in this Report should not be held to indicate that the compiler would join in the commonplacecry against magpies or birds and beasts of prey in general. The ordinary popular notion of the power of such animals to keep others down rests on a misconception of the true relation between animals and their natural enemies. — A note, written by Oluf Winge. ### 29. Nucifraga caryocatactes, L. - Nöddekrige.

Fölleslev. September 27th two in a garden. October 9th one in the field. (F.) - One from Asminderupgaard, E. of Kallundborg, presented in the flesh to the Museum by Mr. S. Clausen, October 5th. - Refsnäs. See »Various notes from the Light-stations«. - Storehedinge. In fall a great passage in Stevns. September 10th one was shot at Storehedinge, 12th one at Gjorslev; from then they were common, and many were shot in different places; at the close of September they diminished in number, but at the middle of October many again arrived; at the close of October they quite disappeared; the last was shot October 29th. Undoubtedly several hundreds have passed over; one day, in the course of half an hour, an observer watched 30 moving away in parties; mostly two or three kept together; but parties of from six to ten were also seen. All the specimens examined were of the leptorhynchus-form, but one pachyrhynchus. (A.) - Vordingborg. A large passage in the later part of September and the beginning of October. (B.) - A flock of seven or eight at Rönne, Bornholm, September 20th; four shot, presented to the Museum by Mr. E. Tryde; all leptorhynchus. - In large numbers on Bornholm at the close of September and in the beginning of October. (Mr. J. Brüel, »Jagttidende«, October and December.)

30. Gecinus viridis, L. — Grönspet. Slagelse. Shot at Slotsbjergby in the summer. (P.)

31. Picus major, L. — Stor Flagspet.
Fölleslev. In September a few times in gardens. (F.)
— Vordingborg. Breeding, not unfrequently. (B.)

32. Jynx torquilla, L. - Vendehals.

Kjöbenhavn. In migration locality: September 16th one in garden. (W.) — Storehedinge. April 22d, seen. (A.) — Sent from the Lights. April: 23d Anholt 1; 24th Anholt 2; 27th Kobbergrunden 1.

### 33. Sitta europaea, L. - Spetmejse.

Vordingborg. Breeding rather commonly. May 6th, nest with eight eggs in a hole in a beech; a slit in the trunk of about one foot in lenght and some inches broad had been filled up, to have the entrance less open. (B.)

### 34. Certhia familiaris, L. - Träpikker.

Vordingborg. Breeding commonly. (B.) — Mors. In the plantation of Nykjöbing some times in November. (F.) - Sent from the Lights. October: 16th Hesselö 1.

35. Lanius excubitor, L. — Stor Tornskade. Vordingborg. About April 20th 1885 one shot. (B.)

### 36. Lanius collurio, L. - Tornskade.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. May 30th one male. June 2d one male in garden (migration locality). (W., H. W.) — Amager. May 22d first ones in a place, where this summer three pairs were breeding; July 17th first young flown; September 4th last seen in this place. September 18th one in another place. (K.)

37. Muscicapa grisola, L. - Graa Fluesnapper.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. May 5th one in garden, thence continually; May 7th two. In garden four young left nest June 3oth; July 8th young almost full grown, the moult beginning. August 17th again just flown young in garden. Continually in garden to August 26th. September 17th one. (W.) — Vordingborg. Breeds in the gardens. (B.) — Viborg. May 15th, first. (F.) — Sent from the Lights. September: 18th Skjoldnäs 1.

38. Muscicapa luctuosa, Scop. - Broget Fluesnapper.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds, but most pass on. From May 6th to 31st rather frequently in migration localities. Reappeared, clean-moulted, in garden July 29th; it was seen again August 11th and thence rather continually to September 13th. (W.) — May 1st seen N. of Kjöbenhavn. (Hl.) Ornis VI. 2. u. 8.

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- Vordingborg. Rather uncommon. (B.) - Sent from the Lights. August: 28th Skjoldnäs 1. September: 13th Anholt 1; 16th Läsö Rende 1, Kobbergrunden 4, Anholt 3, Hesselö 1, Sprogö 2, Skjoldnäs 1, Gjedser 2; 18th Hesselö 1.

39. Accentor modularis, L. - Jernspurv. Vordingborg. Common, breeding. (B.)

40. Troglodytes parvulus, Koch. - Gjerdesmutte.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. In winter and migration localities from beginning of year to close of March. Reappeared in the same localities September 26th and stayed for the winter. (W.) — Sent from the Lights. October: 16th Hesselö 1.

### 41. Parus ater, L. - Sortmejse.

Kjöbenhavn. In garden August 17th one, September 7th one; in a garden in town November 12th one. (W., H. W.)

### 42. Parus major, L. - Musvit.

Sent from the Lights. October: 15th Läsö Trindel 1; 29th Läsö Rende 1.

### 43. Acredula caudata, L. - Halemejse.

Rather common in Slagelse Skov. (P.) — Vordingborg. Not uncommon. May 11th 1886 a nest was found containing twenty two eggs, evidently of two broods. Usually not more than eleven eggs are to be found in a nest. (B.)

44. Regulus cristatus, Koch. - Fuglekonge.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. January 5th and 9th some. Observed in spring migration April 8th and 12th. In autumn in migration localities September 21st, October 3d to 13th almost every day, 16th, 20th, 29th; November 2d, 4th, 12th, 19th, 30th; December 1st, 15th, 19th, 26th. (W., H. W.) — Sent from the Lights. April: 1st Hesselö 6 d. October: 13th Skjoldnäs 1 Q; 16th Hesselö 3 (1 d, 2 Q), Hjelm 1 d; 17th Skjoldnäs 2 d. November: 10th Skjoldnäs 1. 45. Phyllopneuste sibilatrix, Bechst. — Grön Lövsanger.
 Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. In migration localities: April 30th
 one singing; May 3d one singing. (W.)

46. Phyllopneuste trochilus, L. - Lövsanger.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. April 24th singing in three places: 30th one; from May 2d to 24th common in migration localities. In autumn observed in migration localities: August 11th, 22d, 27th, September 4th, 11th, and 16th singing. (W.) — Storehedinge. April 28th, first. (A.) — Vordingborg. Very common, breeding. (B.) — Sent from the Lights. April: 27th Kobbergrunden 1 (2 killed). May: 29th Hjelm 1. August: 23d Läsö Rende 3. ### 83. Fringilla montifringilla, L. - Kväker.

Kjöbenhavn. January 1st two; 2d, 4th, 9th, 16th, April 1st and 10th, September 28th, a few. (W., H. W.) — Sent from the Lights. January: 6th Helholm 1 d. April: 24th Anholt 1 Q. October: 16th Hesselö 1 d.

### 84. Ligurinus chloris, L. - Svenske.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. In January some. February 28th first singing, thence dayly. A few times in October, November

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and December. (W., H. W.) — Amager. Seen all the year, sometimes in small flocks up to ten. (K.) — Fölleslev. In fall in flocks; September 24th a flock of about 100 at Snertinge. — Viborg. January in flocks in gardens. Breeding in some places. (F.)

85. Serinus hortulanus, Koch. - Gulirisk.

February 28th one, a female, was shot by Mr. Niels Olesen in the plantation of Hjörring, Vendsyssel. It had not been in company with other birds. The specimen was sent, in the flesh, to the Zoological Museum of Kjöbenhavn by Mr. Julius Wulff of Hjörring. No signs of confinement were to be detected. The contents of the stomach were particles of seeds of Brassica or other Cruciferae. — Not previously noticed in Danmark.

This occurence of Serinus hortulanus in Danmark would have been interesting, if it had been certain that the bird was really wild. But unfortunately the species has been artificially introduced into some places in North-Germany, so that the study of its natural geographical distribution has been rendered almost impossible.

### 86. Chrysomitris spinus, L. - Sisken.

90. Linaria alnorum, C. L. Br. — Graasisken. Kjöbenhavn. November 12th; 28th two. (W.)

91. Loxia pityopsittacus, Bechst. - Stort Korsnäb.

Two shot at Rönne, Bornholm, November 29th, presented to the Museum by Mr. E. Tryde.

### 92. Columba palumbus, L. - Ringdue.

Fölleslev. Breeding in the garden of Egemarke and in Daverup Skov. (F.) — Vordingborg. Numerous. May 3d, nest with almost fullgrown young; August 28th, nest with fresh eggs. (B.) — Viborg. May 15th, nest with two eggs. (F.)

### 93. Starna cinerea, Lath. - Agerhöne.

Amager. See Report for 1885. (K.) — Fölleslev. In autumn many large flocks. — Mors. At Nykjöbing, July 1st, nest with 18 eggs. (F.)

### 94. Charadrius squatarola, L. - Strandhjejle.

Amager. On west coast; this year more numerous than usual. None seen before August 14th. August 14th, 21st, and 27th, September 4th, 11th, 18th, 25th, October 2d and 9th many seen, singly or in smaller or larger flocks; the largest flocks numbering about 40 individuals; often in company with *Tringa alpina*. October 9th especially numerous; October 16th several; later none. (K.) — Fölleslev. September — October, some shot. (F.) — Sent from the Lights. September: 18th Skjoldnäs 2, old and young.

### 95. Charadrius pluvialis, L. - Hjejle, Brokfugl.

Amager. On west coast, August 7th one; September 11th some small flocks, 25th one. (K.) — Fölleslev. September — October, larger and smaller flocks. — Viborg. April 7th four. — Mors. November, immense numbers. (F.) — Sent from the Lights. September 27th Hjelm 1.

96. Aegialites cantianus, Lath. - Hvidbrystet Prästekrave.

Amager. April 24th rather common. (Hl.) — On northern part of east coast: May 1st many, 8th and 15th some small flocks; 29th fewer, in all about 40; June 5th only two or three. 14th two at the pool on Amager Common. 19th and 26th many on west coast, singly or in pairs, evidently breeding; 19th one young one seen. July 5th one on east coast; 17th in the same place two, and two at the pool. On west coast: August 7th a small flock, 14th some small flocks and many singly. None later. (K.) — Saltholm. ### 97. Aegialites hiaticula, L. - Prästekrave.

### 98. Aegialites minor, M. - Lille Prästekrave.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. Mai 1st male and female in a breeding place. (W.) — Amager. A pair breeding on the pool on Amager Common, first seen May 15th; three young ones, a few days old, were seen, one of them June 27th, the other two July 1st; the old birds, or at least one of them, stayed at the pool till July 17th; in May a few times three old birds were seen in the place. June 5th and 14th and July 17th each day one on east coast. Later none, (K.)

### 99. Vanellus cristatus, M. & W. - Vibe.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. March 2d one in a breeding place. (W.) — Amager. April 10th first, three. June 5th, nest with four eggs; June 19th the same nest contained one egg and one young. June 26th in another place about seven young ones just able to fly. August 19th and 21st small flocks, September 4th and 18th singly, October 2d a small flock, 23d a flock of about 20, last. (K.) - Fölleslev.October 18th a small flock, 22d a larger flock. (F.) -Storehedinge. March 4th one; main-passage March 23d. (A.).- May 28th on Rödby Fjord, Lolland, some nests with fresh eggs. (B.) - Viborg. February 23d first. - Mors.November, large numbers, in company with Plovers. (F.)

100. Strepsilas interpres, L. - Stenvender. Saltholm. June 5th, one. (Hl.)

### 101. Haematopus ostralegus, L. - Strandskade.

Amager. On east coast, March 27th first, two very large flocks; April 3d, 10th, 17th, 24th, May 1st, and 8th large flocks; May 15th some smaller flocks, 22d a flock of five or six, 29th about 50, June 5th 30-40. July 27th a flock of nine. September 18th two. On southern part of west coast, June 19th a pair, 26th two pairs, August 7th a small flock, 21st one, September 25th four. Later none. The large flocks, when wading on the east coast, are often intermingled with Larus canus, Xema ridibundum and Corvus cornix and frequently are also accompanied by Aegialites hiaticula and cantianus and Tringa alpina. (K.) - Saltholm. June 5th, in great numbers. (Hl.) - Fölleslev. On Vester Lyng, September 19th four. (F.) - Vordingborg. Breeding commonly, on Lilleö, Kalvö, Höjrönnen, and Dybsö (B.) - Mors. At Nykjöbing, June 7th, nest with two eggs. (F.)

### 102. Grus cinerea, M. - Trane.

Kjöbenhavn. April 22d, a considerable flight passing N. at 10 A. M. (H. W.) — Amager. April 24th, at midday 14 or 15 passing N. (K.) — Storehedinge. April 23d, eight seen passing. (A.)

### 103. Ciconia alba, Bechst. -- Stork.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. May 1st at 1,50 P. M. one circling to an immense height, then going away to S. E.; cloudy, N. W., fresh. August 7th, 12,55 P. M., one going N. (W.) — Amager. Only occasionally seen. July 27th one passing to S. along east coast; S. E., strong. August 7th, one soaring aloft. (K.) — Fölleslev. One stayed to October 18th. (F.) — Slagelse. Scarce; only one nest seen. (P.) — Vordingborg. Arrived at Iselingen: 1878, April 10th; 80, 14th; 82, 16th; 83, 14th; 84, 18th; 86, 15th; 87, 26th. (B.) — Mors. Nykjöbing. The tame Stork (see Report 85), a male, this year, for the first time, paired with a wild female; they had nest on a house in the town and reared young. At the time of passage he went away with his family, but after ten days he returned. (F.)

104. Ciconia nigra, L. - Sort Stork.

Occasionally it may be seen wading on the coast S. of Ribe. (P.)

105. Ardea cinerea, L. - Hejre.

Amager. August 7th and 14th singly or two together. (K.) — April 17th, at Söndersö, N. of Kjöbenhavn, about ten nests with the birds sitting. (Hl.) — Fölleslev. On Vester Lyng small flocks in September. (F.) — Storehedinge. March 2d, seen. (A.)

106. Botaurus stellaris, L. - Rördrum.

Lolland. Since 1873 it has disappeared from Maribo Sö. (Wichfeld, B.)

107. Rallus aquaticus, L. — Vandrixe. Sent from the Lights. April: 27th Kobbergrunden 1.

### 108. Callinula pygmaea, Naum.

May 4th and 5th one was seen on Söholm Möllesö at Gjorslev, Stevns, by Mr. Valentiner; May 6th it was again seen and shot (some further particulars have been given by Mr. Baagöe in »Jagttidende«, August); the specimen was sent to the Museum for accurate determination. The species had not previously been noticed in Danmark.

109. Gallinula porzana, L. - Rörvagtel.

Vordingborg. May 22d, nest, with ten eggs, in Skaverup Mose. (B.) — Viborg. July 18th was brought an egg found in a deserted nest at Vint Mölle. (F.)

### 110. Gallinula chloropus, L. - Rörhöne.

Vordingborg. Seen some times in a small moor at Rosenfeld. (B.)

### 111. Fulica atra, L. - Blishöne.

Kjöbenhavn. May 8th, nest with six eggs. (Hl.) — Vordingborg. Not common, in spite of there being many suitable localities. May 29th 1886, nest with seven incubated eggs, in Kjöng Nor. — Lolland. May 28th, on Rödby Fjord, many nests with eggs and young. (B.)

### 112. Numenius arquatus, L. - Regnspove.

Amager. From April 23d to 27th every night, about 11 or 12 P. M., the call was heard of Curlews passing N. May 8th two on east coast. On southern part of west coast: August 21st and 27th singly and in small flocks; September 4th a few, 18th a large flock. Later none. (K.) — Fölleslev. On Vester Lyng, small flocks in fall. (F.)

113. Numenius phaeopus, L. - Lille Regnspove.

In August seen in flocks in the fields. S of Ribe. (P.)

114. Limosa lapponica, L. - Kobbersneppe.

Amager. September 4th one shot on west coast; a small flock on east coast. October 2d one shot on west coast. (K.) — Fölleslev. September 10th one shot on Vester Lyng from a small party. (F.) — Sent from the Lights. September: 18th Hesselö 1, young. Ornis VI. 2. u. 3. 25

### 115. Scolopax rusticola, L. - Skovsneppe.

Fölleslev. October 11th one seen; 14th one shot. (F.) — Slagelse. November 10th, one shot. (P.) — Storehedinge. March 24th, shot. (A.) — Notes on its breeding in Danmark, »Jagttidende« for June and September.

### 116. Gallinago scolopacina, Bp. – Horsegjög, Dobbelt Bekkasin.

Amager. In the reedy pools on east coast, July 21st one; August 19th a few; September 11th, 18th, October 2d each day about 12; October 9th about seven, 16th and 3oth about five. (K.) — Fölleslev. September—October, some. (F.) — Vordingborg. A few pairs breeding in Skaverup and Barre Mose. (B.) — Mors. November, many. (F.) — Sent from the Lights. September: 17th Skagen 1.

### 117. Gallinago gallinula, L. - Buk, Enkelt Bekkasin.

Amager. On east coast in reedy pools, October 9th about five (three shot), 16th two. (K.) — Fölleslev. October, frequently. — Mors. November, many. (F.) — Sent from the Lights. September: 17th Skagen 1. November: 7th Anholt 1; 14th Nakkehoved 1.

### 118. Totanus calidris, L. - Rödben.

Amager. On west coast, June 19th two, 26th one; August 7th, 14th and 21st each day in small flocks and singly; September 4th a few, 11th one. July 21st one on east coast. (K.) — Vordingborg. Very common, especially on Kalvö and Lilleö. — Lolland. May 28th many nests on Fugleö in Rödby Fjord. (B.) — Viborg. Breeding commonly in the meadows at Skals Aa, May—June. (F.)

### 119. Totanus glottis, Bechst. - Hvidklire.

Amager. On west coast, August 7th one shot, 21st some in small flocks and some singly, 27th one, September 4th small flocks and singly. (K.) — Storehedinge. August 10th two shot. (A.)

### 120. Totanus glareola, L. - Tinksmed.

Amager. On east coast, July 21st three together and some singly, August 11th one, 19th not a few, September 4th two. (K.) — Viborg. Some pairs breeding on Skals Aa, May—June. (F.)

### 121. Actitis hypoleucus, L. - Mudderklire.

Kjöbenhavn. August 26th, 8,45 P. M., heard passing over garden. September 11th one on coast. (W., H. W.) — Amager. At the fortification canals and on east coast: May 6th first, a flock of seven; 8th, 15th and 22d some. July 5th one; 17th, 21st, 27th, August 11th, 19th, September 4th many; September 18th one. Not later. (K.) — Breeding every year at Endrupholm. (P.)

### 122. Machetes pugnax, L. - Brushane.

Amager. August 11th, on east coast, one shot. (K.) — Vordingborg. Only one time found breeding: Kalvö, May 24th. (B.) — Viborg. Some pairs on Skals Aa in May; the males observed fighting. (F.).

### 123. Tringa cinerea, L. - Islandsk Ryle.

Amager. On west coast, August 7th one old bird, 21st two young birds; September 11th several, in small flocks and singly; 25th one, young. (K.) — Fölleslev. In September some, in winter dress, were shot on Vester Lyng; almost always they were in company with Tringa alpina. (F.) — Sent from the Lights. September: 13th Anholt 1, young.

### 124. Tringa alpina, L. - Ryle.

Amager. April 24th very numerous on west coast, singly and in pairs. (Hl.) — On east coast: May 1st many, in small flocks; 8th, 15th, 29th, and June 5th each day many, yet decreasing; July 3d one, 5th and 17th each day a small flock, 21st some small flocks, 27th two flocks, the largest of about 30, August 19th four together, September 4th some small flocks, 11th one small flock, 18th a very

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large flock, October 23d a flock of about 30. On west coast: June 19th and 26th in great numbers, singly or in pairs, breeding; August 7th, 14th, 21st, 27th, and September 4th each day many small flocks; 11th and 18th in greater numbers; 25th, October 2d, 9th and 16th each day many flocks, some of them enormous, often conducted by one or more *Charadrius squatarola*; October 23d one. None later. (K.) — Saltholm. June 5th common. (Hl.) — Fölleslev. On Vester Lyng in large flocks in fall. (F.) — Vordingborg. Very common. (B.) — Viborg. On Skals Aa, May, commonly breeding. (F.) — Sent from the Lights. March: 28th Skjoldnäs 1, winter dress. September 13th Anholt 1, young.

### 125. Tringa subarquata, Güldenst. - Krumnäbet Ryle.

Amager. This year much more numerous than usual. August 21st many on west coast, in smaller and larger flocks, more numerous than *Tringa alpina*; 27th one small flock. September 4th some small flocks on east coast; 11th a few on both west and east coast. Several were shot, only one of which was old. The flocks were seen in company with *Tringa alpina*, *T. minuta* and *Totanus glottis*. (K.)

### 126. Tringa temmincki, Leisl.

Amager. On the pool on Amager Common: May 15th about 22; 19th, 18; 29th at least 12; July 27th four. (K.)

127. Tringa minuta, Leisl. - Dvärgryle.

Amager. More numerous than usual. August 14th on west coast a small flock, 21st many small flocks; September 4th small flocks on both west and east coast; 11th three small flocks on east coast; 18th on west and east coast a few. Observed in company with Tringa subarquata, T. alpina and Aegialites hiaticula. (K.) - Fölleslev. September 10th one shot on Vester Lyng out of a flock of Tringa alpina. (F.) 128. Limicola platyrhyncha, Temm. — Brednäbet Ryle.

Amager. August 11th one young bird shot on east coast; it was alone. (K.)

129. Calidris arenaria, L. - Selning.

Fölleslev. September 19th some few in a large flock of *Tringa alpina*; one shot. (F.) — One shot at Korshage, on the Isefjord, August 27th, presented to the Museum by Mr. Busse.

130. Recurvirostra avocetta, L. - Klyde.

Vordingborg. Uncommon. A few pairs breeding on Dybsö. May 14th 1885 two pairs breeding on Lilleö. — Lolland. May 29th on Hyllekrog, three nests, each with four eggs. (B.)

131. Bernicla torquata, Bechst. - Knortegaas, Rajgaas.

Fölleslev. In flocks under coast in fall. (F.) — Vordingborg. Arriving in large flocks in April, staying to close of May. (B.)

### 132. Anser cinereus, M. - Graagaas.

Fölleslev. Flocks frequently in fall. (F.) — Storehedinge. February 26th a flock. (A.) — Vordingborg. Breeding in some of the moors; May 29th 1886, nest with six eggs in Kjöng Nor. (B.) — Mors. November, a large flock stayed for some time at Legind Vejle. (F.)

### 133. Cygnus olor, Gm. - Knopsvane.

Storehedinge. January 17th, at Rödvig, a flock of seven; one shot. (A.) — Lolland. One pair yearly breeding on a small holm in Rödby Fjord. (B.)

### 134. Cygnus musicus, Bechst. — Sangsvane.

Amager. February 20th some small flocks, together about 40, outside south coast. (K.) — Vordingborg. In the winter 1887-88 many shot. (B.) — Mors. November 14th six; 28th three flocks, each numbering from 10 to 20. (F.)

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135. Tadorna cornuta, S. G. Gm. - Gravand.

Amager. April 24th several on west coast. (H1.) — On west coast, June 19th a pair; 26th in pairs or in small flocks, the largest of which numbered 13; August 21st six together; September 18th four. (K.) — Vordingborg. Not a few breeding. — Lolland. May 29th, nest, with four eggs, under some parts of an old wreck on Hyllekrog. (B.)

### 136. Spatula clypeata, L. - Skeand.

Viborg. At the mouth of Skals Aa, May-June, a pair, evidently breeding. (F.)

137. Anas boschas, L. - Stokand, Graaand.

Amager. July 27th and August 11th, each day three. (K.) — Fölleslev. Often in fall on Vester Lyng. (F.) — Vordingborg. Breeds plentifully. (B.) — Viborg. Breeding at Viborg Sö. (F.) — Sent from the Lights. November: 11th Hirtsholm 2 ( $\mathcal{C}$  Q, 5 killed).

138. Anas acuta, L. - Spidsand.

Saltholm. June 5th, one male. (Hl.)

139. Anas crecca, L. - Krikand.

Amager. On east coast, October 9th a flock of about 20; November 13th two, 27th three. (K.) — Fölleslev. September—October, frequently. (F.) — Breeding in Aalesö in Slagelse Skov. (P.) — Viborg. In the meadows at Skals Aa, June 2d, nest with nine incubated eggs; the eggs were hatched a few days later. — Mors. November—December, in flocks in Legind Sö. (F.) — Sent from the Lights. September: 12th Läsö Rende 1 Q.

140. Anas penelope, L. - Pibeand.

Fölleslev. Frequently on Vester Lyng in the autumn. (F.) – Sent from the Lights. October: 15th Skagen 5 (7 killed); 23d Hammershus 1 (4 killed). 141. Fuligula marila, L. — Bjergand. Sent from the Lights. October: 22d Kronborg 1 d, young. December: 5th Läsö Rende 1 d, young.

142. Fuligula cristata, Leach. - Troldand.

Kjöbenhavn. Gjentofte Sö, April 10th 27, males and females. (H. W.)

### 143. Clangula glaucion, L. - Hvinand.

Kjöbenhavn. May 1st larger and smaller flocks in Furesö; December 11th several small flocks in Furesö and Bagsvärd Sö (Hl.) — Fölleslev. In flocks at the coast in fall. — Viborg. In numbers in Hald Sö, March—April. (F.)

### 144. Oidemia nigra, L. - Sortand.

Fölleslev. October, small flocks at the coast. (F.) — Sent from the Lights. January: 25th Läsö Trindel 1 3. October: 22d Kronborg 1 Q. November: 15th Läsö Rende 1 Q.

### 145. Oidemia fusca, L. - Flöjelsand.

Mors. November-December, singly and in small flocks on the Limfjord. (F.) — Sent from the Lights. February: 20th Läsö Rende 1 Q.

146. Somateria mollissima, L. - Ederfugl.

Fölleslev. October 22d a large flock of females and a few old males under coast. (F.)

147. Somateria spectabilis, L. - Konge-Ederfugl.

March 4th a female was sent in the flesh to the Zoological Museum by Mr. H. Christensen of Kjerteminde. It had been shot out of a flock of Common Eiders at Romsö.

148. Mergus serrator, L. - Toppet Skallesluger.

Fölleslev. A flock of large ducklings at Vester Lyng in September. One or some pairs were often seen in September-October. (F.) — Vordingborg. Breeding commonly.

On Tärö many nests found, especially under the outlying branches of spruces. — Lolland. May 29th, nest with 12 eggs on Hyllekrog. (B.)

### 149. Uria troile, L. - Lomvie.

Amager. January 28th one shot on west coast. (K.) - Sent from the Lights. January: 6th Läsö Trindel 1.

### 150. Alca torda, L. - Alk.

Amager. January 28th one shot on west coast. — Sent from the Lights. January: 20th Läsö Trindel 1.

### 151. Podiceps cristatus, L. - Stor Lappedykker.

Fureso: May 1st very numerous, in pairs and in flocks, in one place about 60. December 11th one. — Arreso: May 30th and June 1st common. — Esrom Sö: at close of June numerous. (Hl.) — Viborg. Breeds commonly on all the lakes. Ved Sö, June 4th six pairs; one nest found, with six eggs. Viborg Sö, June 17th two nests, each with five eggs; on these being taken, the two nests had two and three eggs on June 27th and five and six on July 7th. (F.)

### 152. Podiceps rubricollis, Gm. - Graastrubet Lappedykker.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeding [as usual. H. W.] in Fuglesangsöen; had arrived April 11th. (Hl.) — Sent from the Lights. March: 25th Läsö Rende 1.

153. Colymbus septentrionalis, L. - Almindelig Lom.

Vordingborg. December 22d one shot. (B.)

154. Sula bassana, L. - Sule.

One found dead on west coast of Jylland at Blaavands Huk, sent in the flesh to the Museum by Mr. A. Lorentzen, received April 23d. One found dead on Skagen, sent to the Museum by Mr. Ancher, received May 19th. 155. Thalassidroma leachi, Temm. - Stor Stormsvale.

Sent from the Lights. January: 3d Läsö Trindel 1; 12th Schultz's Grund 1. April: 27th Horns Rev 1. November: 10th Läsö Trindel 1. December: 4th Läsö Trindel 1.

156. Lestris parasitica, L. - Spidshalet Kjove.

One, young female, shot on Skagen, presented in the flesh to the Museum by Mr. Kröyer, September 20th.

### 157. Larus marinus, L. - Svartbag.

Amager. Young birds as usual. Old birds, singly or two together, January 9th, 30th, October 30th; October 2d a flock of about ten. (K.) — Fölleslev. Singly at Vester Lyng in fall. (F.)

### 158. Larus argentatus, Brünn. - Havmaage.

Fölleslev. Common at Vester Lyng in fall. (F.) — Vordingborg. Not unfrequently met with, but not found breeding. — Lolland. On Hyllekrog its nests are found in considerable numbers. (B.) — Sent from the Lights. February: 21st Schultz's Grund 1.

### 159. Larus canus, L. - Stormmaage.

Amager. In usual numbers, often in very large flocks. (K.) — Fölleslev. Flocks in the fields and at the coast in fall. (F.) — Lolland. Several times four eggs found in the nests on Hyllekrog. (B.)

### 160. Xema ridibundum, L. - Hättemaage.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. On Sound, January 1st and 6th some old and young; 16th and 18th a good many, most old, all white-headed. March 15th two young and one old with hood; 27th several old with hood. — October, November, December, several, old and young. (W., H. W.) — Amager. March 6th first, a flock of about five; from April 3d to August 11th frequently seen in smaller or larger flocks. October 16th and 23d, each day a very large flock.

(K.) — Fölleslev. In fall frequently in flocks in the fields. (F.) — Vordingborg. Very commonly breeding on the small islands. May 19th, in Kjöng Mose, two nests were found, constructed of different weeds, one foot high. — Lolland. Breeding on Hyllekrog. (B.)

161. Sterna argentata, C. L. Br. - Havterne.

Vordingborg. Very common. Breeding on Dybsö, Kalvö, and Lilleö; eggs seen in May and June. — Lolland. Breeding on the holms in Rödby Fjord. (B.)

162. Sterna fluviatilis, Naum. - Terne.

Kjöbenhavn. Breeds. May 4th three, first. (W.) — Lolland. Colonies on the holms in Maribo Sö. (B.)

163. Sterna minuta, L. - Dvärgterne.

Amager. July 21st at least three; August 11th one, 14th two. (K.) — Vordingborg. Rather uncommon. Single pairs on Kalvö and Höjrönnen. (B.)

164. Hydrochelidon nigra, L. - Moseterne,

Amager. August 11th one shot at the pool on Amager Common. (K.) — Vordingborg. Some few pairs yearly breeding at Kjöng Nor. (B.) — Viborg. June, some pairs breeding at Ved Sö. (F.)

Various Notes from the Light-Stations.

Bovbjerg. February 20th 32 Swans passing to S.; calm overcast. February 26th two Swans going S. E.; westerly, clear. April 19th about 30 Geese passing north; N. W., overcast, hazy. September 16th a great flight of Geese to S.; S. S. E., overcast, hazy. October 14th 11 Swans to N. E.; N. N. E., stormy, snow showers. December 21st 25 Swans to N. E.; E. N. E., overcast. December 31st 19 Swans to S. E.; calm, clear. - E. Rasmussen. Hirtshals. March 8th first Starlings seen at their old nesting place; W., fresh. March 19th a few Lapwings seen; under coast large flocks of Eiders; S., light. March 27th the Woodcock seen; Jackdaws and Crows passing in flocks; Dunlin ("Ryle") and Wagtail have arrived; easterly, fresh. April 4th some Thrushes seen; Birds of prey soaring aloft; westerly, fresh. April 18th a Stork seen. — E. T. B. Jensen.

Skagen. No birds breeding near the station. Many Gulls are seen all the year; large flocks of Eiders at the close of December. - M. G. Poulsen.

Skagens Rev L. V. January 21st at  $12\frac{1}{2}$  P. M. a white Pigeon alighted on the ship; in evening it was caught; W., strong, hazy. February 26th first Lark seen. November 3d at 2 P. M. a blue Pigeon and a little bird came to the vessel; the Pigeon flew away at evening; S. S. E., strong, overcast. November 16th a Bullfinch settled on the vessel; S. W., strong, overcast. — J. G. Steinmann.

Läsö Trindel L. V. January 19th some flocks of Eiders flying W. — J. Poulsen.

Läsö Rende L. V. January 3d 4 Swans to N. W.; W. S. W., moderate, overcast. March 28th about 20 Swans flying S. E.; S. E., moderate, clear. May 17th first Terns seen. July 25th a large flock of birds, probably Starlings, flying to W. August 25th and 26th a great many Gulls round ship, and, as usual, many Terns. September 14th many Gulls and Terns over the shoals; a Goshawk (?) stayed at the ship for half an hour, sometimes resting in the rigging; it flew away to W.; S. E., light, squally. October 2d several small flocks of White Wagtails flying W.; a great many Hooded Crows passing W.; one, having the wings damaged, settled on the ship; having rested for an hour it flew to W.; N., clear. November 13th and the preceding days many sea-birds, Geese and Ducks, over the shoal; clear, calm. December 10th 3 Swans, two old and one young, swimming not far from the ship; after an hour they flew away to W.; S. W., moderate, clear. December 27th one

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Cormorant settled on the ship and walked about on the deck for half an hour; then it was put over board, but it kept for a long time close to the ship; N. E., strong, cloudy. December 29th 7 Swans flying to S. W.; N. E., moderate, clear. In the last days of December several large flocks of Brent Geese, Ducks, and other sea-birds flying E. and S. E.; some small flocks of Swans in various directions. — L. Lauritzen.

Kobbergrunden L. V. From end of February to end of April flocks of black Ducks, numbering from 10 to 50, on the water round the ship. March 27th 14 Swans flying E.; N. E., strong, hazy. — V. T. Schnipp.

Hesselö. About 10 Starlings wintering on the island. The Lapwing seen at middle of March; March 28th the Sheldrake and the »Skallesluger« seen; these three species breed. April 24th a Grebe cast ashore. In the beginning af September the Lapwing and Sheldrake left the island; yet two Lapwings were seen in the middle of October. — A. G. Saxtorph.

Fornäs. Starlings and Redbreasts are seen in the time of passage. — J. O. Böving.

**Kronborg.** September 9th at midday a flight of Ducks, about 15, to N.; S. W., force 1, clear. September 26th at  $7^{1/2}$  A. M. a flock of Geese, about 20, to N.; W., force 1. clear; October 13th at  $12^{1/2}$  P. M. a flock of Ducks, about 100, to N.; W., force 2, cloudy. October 16th at 1 P. M. a flock of Ducks, about 15, to N.; N., force 2, clear. November 3d at 10 A. M. a flock of Ducks, about 20, to S.; S. E., force 2, hazy. November 9th at  $11^{1/4}$  A. M. two flocks of Ducks, each of about 20 to 30, passing to S.; N. E., force 1, cloudy. December 25th at  $11^{1/2}$  A. M. a flock of Ducks, about 20-30, to S.; N., force 3, cloudy. December 28th at  $12^{1/2}$  P. M. a flock of Ducks to N.; N. E., force 3, clear. — Gjörup.
